Annual Report 2021

What a wonderful year, filled with joy, laughter and opportunities to develop body, mind and spirit! The DreamGirls were waiting eagerly for our monthly girls club to resume, as students returned to schools in February 2021. What a privilege to see the shining eyes, filled with anticipation and excitement as the girls arrive at our venue.

Dream Again Foundation celebrated her 5th year of empowering and equipping girls, age 12 to 18, who live on farms in the Riebeek Kasteel Valley. 2021 was also the year where we saw 3 of our girls -young women now – completing their high school journey with us. We are overjoyed with the knowing, that we played a part in their development and growth over the last 5 years. Our donors and sponsors made it possible to treat them with a High Tea at a local establishment, blessing them and thanking them for their contribution to the foundation and for being examples to the younger girls.

We are happy to report that most of the girls who were enrolled in 2020, continued with their attendance throughout 2021. A new farm were registered with Dream Again Foundation and we welcomed 5 girls. Currently our membership stand on 30 girls and 3 mentors. Lastly, the 5 dedicated leaders, who forms a dynamic Dream Team. These ladies contributed time, brain-power and skills into organising and delivering fun-filled Girls Clubs.

It is also with the help of the skilful educators on the Dream Team, that we could identified the need for a safe space where girls can come regularly for homework-help. Result: the DAF Learning Center was added to our strategy. A strategy where we want to offer educational assistance to girls, which again will enable them with wider choices for future opportunities.

The main focus of our Girls Club this year was to establish self-worth and values. Our aim was to equip girls with tools and skills to navigate their own personal development. Workshops on the importance of keeping a journal, study methods, body awareness and -in a more practical skills-development way- how to use a weaving frame to create a small table cover or mat from discarded fabrics. During the October school holiday the girls participated in a gift card making workshop, which was thoroughly enjoyed.

By being a member of the Girls Club, we believe that DAF is helping the girls to grow in the development of their identity. It is a save place where the girls can learn about value, integrity and commitment. If you belong, then you feel loved and cherished. We believe our Dream Girls will take this mandate of being valued and being valuable, to create opportunity and a future for themselves. We also trust that their micro-communities on the farms will benefit as a result. Our ultimate desire for them is that they feel brave enough to clothed themselves with hope and act upon it.

A big shout out to all our benefactors, sponsors and supporters. Thank you to our Riebeek Kasteel community and also our national and international partners. We count every single small act of

kindness and weave it into a tapestry of love. A blanket of blessings – covering, protecting and promoting our girls! All honour to our Heavenly Father, for loving the girls so much.
